These photographs are part of the Vietnam collections at the KITLV/Royal Netherlands Institute of Southeast Asian and Caribbean Studies in Leiden. KITLV has a main emphasis on the former

Dutch colonies. But its collections of books, photographs, maps and audiovisual materials about Vietnam attract growing numbers of scholars and students from outside Leiden. KITLV's Vietnam collections consist of materials that can benefit studies in the fields of anthropology, linguistics, social sciences, and history. Subject matters include the Vietnam War and its aftermath, Vietnamese literature, and economic, social and political developments. KITLV library provides access to many books and articles about Vietnam. A wide array of Vietnamese language titles is also available, mostly published in Vietnam.

KITLV is an active participant in 'Tracking Development', an international research project on the comparative development trajectories of Southeast Asia, including Vietnam, and Sub-Saharan Africa over the last 50 years.
